
# **Genter**

# **TWU Model**

- Institutional Support
- TWU became involved with the GO projects in spring 2003
- Initially started with the First-Generation College Student Program
- Current programs include:
  - GO Centers
  - Mobile GO Center
  - College Readiness & Access Workshops
- Work-Study Mentorship Program



• Recognized as an Exemplary Model by the THECB



- Over 7500 student mentored through GO activities
- Provided services to over 1100 student/parents through MGC activities
- G-Force assisted over 2500 students through College Enrollment Workshops
- G-Force Members maintain a 3.0 group GPA, Retention Rate over 90%
- G-Force members serve in other leadership roles such as:
  - Presidents and student leaders of other organizations
  - Leadership Institutes
  - Represent G-Force & TWU at conferences
  - Study Abroad
  - National Scholars (HACU, HSF, Gates Millennium Scholar)



## MEMO OF UNDERSTANDING

#### **GO Center Interlocal Agreement**

This Interlocal Agreement is between Texas Woman's University and Bowie High School at Arlington Independent School District. The GO Center/G-Force project is designed to bring college access and financial aid information to K-12 students and parents in the region with the aim of establishing and maintaining permanent GO Centers within the school district. This initiative is in line with the Goals of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's (THECB) *College for All Texans (CFAT)* campaign, which has as its aim the enrollment of 630,000 more students by 2015 in higher education in the State of Texas.

# HIGH SCHOOL RESPONSIBILITIES

- Sign an **MOU or Interlocal Agreement** with TWU
- Designate a high school staff as the GO Center sponsor
- **Provide the scheduling of students** for one-on-one mentoring at the GO Center
- Encourage students, parents, and the school community to use the GO Center
- Assist in the planning or coordinating of activities related to creating a **college-going culture** (college readiness workshop or MGC events)





A GO Center is a designated place at the high school where **G-Force** Members provide answers to all kinds of questions about colleges/universities and careers.

#### A GO Center can be located at the:

- Library
- **Computer Lab**
- Counselors Office
- Career Resource Center
- Class Room
  Parent Center



It is a space that is easily accessible to students & parents.



A network of students, concerned citizens, and/or organizations committed to creating a college-going culture in their school and/or community.



G-Force members raise awareness among students and their families on the value of a higher education, show them how to prepare for college both academically and financially, and motivate students to successfully pursue higher education.

NOTE: G-Force members are NOT counselors, simply facilitators of the process who provide very general information, motivate students to act on that information, help them get started in the process and then refer them to the appropriate resource person for more difficult issues. When peer mentors are able to answer many of the more general questions, the counselor can focus on more difficult issues.






